Re: Legislative Update – 2014 Introduced Legislation

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The deadline to introduce bills for the 2014 Legislative session was on Friday, February 21. There were 1930 bills introduced this session - 631 Senate bills and 1299 Assembly bills. There are expected to be additional committee bills and gut and amends throughout the coming months. All introduced bills, other than the budget bill, may not be heard or acted upon by committee or either house until the bill has been in print for 30 days at which time committees will commence.

Below is a list of bills that have been introduced that we have flagged and are actively tracking on your behalf. Some bills are in spot form or contain intent language to serve as a placeholder for more substantive amendments to be added at a later time. We will be closely monitoring amended bills daily to ensure that we are tracking all relevant bills and that our positions reflect the most current version of amended bills. Additionally, we flagged bills that may have a direct impact on your agencies as well as some that may have only an indirect or marginal impact so please let us know if there are significant bills of note so we can engage on those issues accordingly or if there are bills that we should remove from our tracking altogether.

For your reference, below is the 2014 Legislative Calendar up to the May 30 house of origin deadline.

- **May 9** Last day for **policy committees** to meet and report to the floor **nonfiscal** bills introduced in their house (J.R. 61(b)(6)).
- **May 16** Last day for **policy committees** to meet prior to June 2 (J.R. 61(b)(7)).

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### 1. CA AB 365

**Author:** Mullin (D)  
**Title:** Court Reporting  
**Introduced:** 02/14/2013  
**Last Amend:** 04/03/2013  
**Location:** Senate Judiciary Committee  
**Summary:** Makes clarifying changes to existing law that provides that the report of the official court reporter or official court reporter pro tempore, of any court, duly appointed and sworn, when transcribed and certified as being a correct transcript of the testimony and proceedings in the case, is prima facie evidence of that testimony and proceeding.

### 2. CA AB 579

**Author:** Melendez (R)  
**Title:** Mandatory Supervision  
**Introduced:** 02/20/2013  
**Last Amend:** 01/15/2014  
**Location:** Senate Public Safety Committee  
**Summary:** Amends existing law that authorizes a court, when sentencing a person to county jail for a felony, to commit the person to a county jail for either the full term in custody or to suspend the execution of a concluding portion of the term selected at the court's discretion. Specifies that the mandatory supervision begins upon the release from custody.

### 3. CA AB 883

**Author:** Cooley (D)  
**Title:** Child Sexual Abuse: Prevention Pilot Program  
**Introduced:** 02/22/2013  
**Last Amend:** 01/23/2014  
**Location:** Senate Human Services Committee  
**Summary:** Establishes the Child Sexual Abuse Prevention program as a pilot program to provide prevention and intervention services through public, private, or nonprofit programs that provide those services in volunteer counties. Appropriates a certain sum from the General Fund to certain counties. Provides for eligibility for funding and priority for funding to programs that have demonstrated effectiveness in child sexual abuse or prevention. Requires the collection of data on child abuse.

### 4. CA AB 1256

**Author:** Bloom (D)  
**Title:** Civil Law: Privacy: Entry and Exit of Facilities  
**Introduced:** 02/22/2013  
**Last Amend:** 01/15/2014

**Location:** Senate Judiciary Committee  
**Summary:** Provides the liability factors involved with the physical invasion or privacy for knowingly entering onto another person's property to capture any type of visual image, sound recording, or other physical impression in a manner that is offensive to a reasonable person. Provides that it is unlawful for a person to intentionally interfere with a person's entrance to or exit from a facility, or to injure, intimidate, interfere or to attempt same while interfering with entrance of exit. Defines facility.

#### 5. CA AB 1327

**Author:** Gorell (R)  
**Title:** Unmanned Aircraft Systems  
**Introduced:** 02/22/2013  
**Last Amend:** 01/23/2014  
**Location:** Senate Public Safety Committee  
**Summary:** Prohibits public agencies from using unmanned aircraft systems, or contracting for the use of unmanned aircraft systems, with certain exceptions applicable to law enforcement agencies. Requires public notice to be provided by agencies intending to deploy such aircraft systems. Requires the destruction of images and data obtained by such systems within a specified time period. Prohibits arming such aircraft in any manner. Provides these restrictions are applicable to any of specified entities.

#### 6. CA AB 1438

**Author:** Linder (R)  
**Title:** Sex Offenders: Certificates of Rehabilitations  
**Introduced:** 01/06/2014  
**Location:** Assembly Public Safety Committee  
**Summary:** Makes the provisions for obtaining a certificate of rehabilitation inapplicable to a person who is convicted of engaging in sexual intercourse, sodomy, oral copulation, or sexual penetration with a child who is 10 years of age or younger. Provides that such a person who has obtained a certificate of rehabilitation is not relieved of his or her duty to register as a sex offender.

#### 7. CA AB 1449

**Author:** Perez V (D)  
**Title:** Realignment Omnibus Act of 2014  
**Introduced:** 01/07/2014  
**Location:** Assembly Public Safety Committee  
**Summary:** Relates to the Realignment Omnibus Act of 2014. Requires a sentence to be served in the state prison when the defendant is convicted of a felony otherwise punishable in a county jail and is sentenced to an aggregate term. Requires any person released from prison who has a prior conviction for certain crimes to be subject to parole supervision. Allows a revocation hearing officer to revoke and terminate postrelease community supervision and order the person to confinement in the state prison.

#### 9. CA AB 1498

**Author:** Campos (D)  
**Title:** Protective Orders  
**Introduced:** 01/09/2014  
**Location:** Assembly Public Safety Committee  
**Summary:** Applies specified provisions of existing law to all cases where the defendant is charged with specified sex crimes, including rape, spousal rape, and crimes for which a person is required to register as a sex offender. Authorizes the court to consider the defendant's relationship to the victim, the likelihood of continuing harm the victim, the defendant's criminal history, and any current protective or restraining order issued by any civil or criminal court involving the defendant.

#### 10. [CA AB 1505](#)

**Author:** Garcia (D)  
**Title:** Child Abuse: Mandated Reporters  
**Introduced:** 01/14/2014  
**Location:** ASSEMBLY  
**Summary:** States that it is the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation to provide greater consistency among the kinds of abuse and neglect that must be reported pursuant to the Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting Act.

#### 11. [CA AB 1511](#)

**Author:** Gaines B (R)  
**Title:** Criminal History Information: Animal Control Officers  
**Introduced:** 01/14/2014  
**Location:** Assembly Public Safety Committee  
**Summary:** Requires the Department of Justice and local criminal justice agencies to provide state and local summary criminal history information to an animal control officer for the purposes of performing his or her duties. Permits a local agency to charge a reasonable fee sufficient to cover the costs of providing that information.

#### 12. [CA AB 1517](#)

**Author:** Skinner (D)  
**Title:** DNA Evidence  
**Introduced:** 01/15/2014  
**Location:** Assembly Public Safety Committee  
**Summary:** Encourages a law enforcement agency to submit sexual assault forensic evidence to the crime lab as soon as practically possible, but no later than 5 days after being booked into evidence, and that the crime lab process evidence, create DNA profiles when able, and upload qualifying DNA profiles into the Combined DNA Index System as soon as practically possible.

#### 13. [CA AB 1526](#)

**Author:** Holden (D)  
**Title:** Wiretapping: Authorization  
**Introduced:** 01/17/2014

**Location:** Assembly Public Safety Committee  
**Summary:** Extends the operation of existing law that establishes a procedure for a prosecutor to apply for, and a court to issue, an order authorizing law enforcement to intercept a wire or electronic communication. Requires the Attorney General to prepare and submit an annual report to the Legislature, the Judicial Council, and the Director of the Administrative Office of the United States Courts regarding these interceptions.

#### 14. [CA AB 1542](#)

**Author:** Waldron (R)  
**Title:** Theft: Lost Property  
**Introduced:** 01/23/2014  
**Location:** ASSEMBLY  
**Summary:** Makes technical, nonsubstantive changes to existing law that makes it a crime for a person who finds lost property under circumstances that give him or her knowledge of or means of inquiry as to the true owner, and who appropriates the property to his or her own use, or to the use of another person not entitled thereto, without first making reasonable and just efforts to find the owner and to restore the property to him or her.

#### 15. [CA AB 1545](#)

**Author:** Gray (D)  
**Title:** Firearms: Ownership  
**Introduced:** 01/23/2014  
**Location:** Assembly Public Safety Committee  
**Summary:** Creates an exemption from the requirement in existing law to complete a firearms transaction through a licensed dealer for a person who reports his or her ownership of a firearm to the Department of Justice. Requires the department to register the firearm within 30 days of the receipt of the report. Applies those restrictions to a person who is exempt from completing a firearms transaction through a licensed firearms dealer or who moves out of state with the firearm.

#### 16. [CA AB 1563](#)

**Author:** Donnelly (R)  
**Title:** Firearms  
**Introduced:** 01/29/2014  
**Location:** ASSEMBLY  
**Summary:** Makes technical, nonsubstantive changes to existing law that generally regulates the transfer and possession of firearms and defines firearm in various ways for various regulatory purposes.

#### 17. [CA AB 1585](#)

**Author:** Alejo (D)  
**Title:** Human Trafficking  
**Introduced:** 02/03/2014  
**Location:** Assembly Public Safety Committee  
**Summary:** Provides that if a defendant has been convicted of solicitation or prostitution and has

completed any term of probation for that conviction, the defendant may petition the court for relief if the defendant can establish by clear and convincing evidence that the conviction was the result of his or her status as a victim of human trafficking. Provides the options for the court.

#### 18. CA AB 1591

**Author:** Achadjian (R)  
**Title:** Firearms: Prohibited Persons: Notification  
**Introduced:** 02/03/2014  
**Location:** Assembly Public Safety Committee  
**Summary:** Relates to existing law which requires a court to notify the Department of Justice of specified court actions that would result in an individual being prohibited from processing firearms and deadly weapons or result in the individual no longer being subject to that prohibition. Requires a court to provide those electronic notices to the department as soon as possible, but not later than 24 hours after taking the relevant action.

#### 19. CA AB 1598

**Author:** Rodriguez (D)  
**Title:** Emergency Medical Services: Active Shooter Incidents  
**Introduced:** 02/04/2014  
**Location:** ASSEMBLY  
**Summary:** States the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation that would encourage the development of protocols and collaborative training platforms between local fire, police, and emergency medical services agencies in an effort to more efficiently respond to active shooter incidents in the state.

#### 20. CA AB 1607

**Author:** Fox (D)  
**Title:** Sexually Violent Predators  
**Introduced:** 02/05/2014  
**Location:** Assembly Public Safety Committee  
**Summary:** Amends existing law that provides for the civil commitment of criminal offenders who have been determined to be sexually violent predators for treatment in a secure state hospital facility and requires the court, if it decides a petition for conditional release is not frivolous, to give notice prior to the hearing date for the petition. Requires the court to give notice of the petition hearing at least 35 court days prior to the hearing date.

#### 21. CA AB 1609

**Author:** Alejo (D)  
**Title:** Firearms  
**Introduced:** 02/06/2014  
**Location:** Assembly Public Safety Committee  
**Summary:** Relates to firearm transactions, including a waiting period, purchaser background check, and possession of a handgun safety certificate by the purchaser. Requires a California

resident who seeks to own and possess within the state a firearm acquired from outside the state to have the firearm delivered to a dealer in this state for delivery.

## 22. CA AB 1610

**Author:** Bonta (D)  
**Title:** Material Witnesses: Human Trafficking  
**Introduced:** 02/06/2014  
**Location:** Assembly Public Safety Committee  
**Summary:** Authorizes the defendant or the people to apply for an order that the witness be examined conditionally when the material witness is a victim of or witness to a felony prosecution involving human trafficking, commercial sex acts, or forced labor or services.

## 23. CA AB 1623

**Author:** Atkins (D)  
**Title:** Family Justice Centers  
**Introduced:** 02/10/2014  
**Location:** Assembly Public Safety Committee  
**Summary:** Authorizes any city, county, or community-based nonprofit organization to establish a multiagency, multidisciplinary family justice center to assist victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, elder abuse, and human trafficking. Specifies additional confidentiality provisions relating to information disclosed by a victim in a family justice center. Requires each center to maintain a mandatory training for all staff members, volunteers, and agency professionals.

## 24. CA AB 1633

**Author:** Ammiano (D)  
**Title:** Board of State and Community Corrections  
**Introduced:** 02/10/2014  
**Location:** ASSEMBLY  
**Summary:** Makes a technical, nonsubstantive change to existing law establishing the Board of State and Community Corrections and setting its powers and duties, including collecting and maintaining information about correctional policies, practices, capacities and needs.

## 25. CA AB 1640

**Author:** Jones-Sawyer (D)  
**Title:** Sex Offenders : Registration  
**Introduced:** 02/11/2014  
**Location:** Assembly Public Safety Committee  
**Summary:** Relates to sex offenders registration. Deletes from the list of offenses requiring registration, sodomy, oral copulation, and sexual penetration, if in each case the offender participates in the offense with another person who is under 18 years of age or when the offender is over 21 years of age and participates in the offense with another person who is under 16 years of age. Includes communication with intent to commit such offenses.

## 26. CA AB 1648

**Author:** Maienschein (R)  
**Title:** Criminal Procedure: Warrants of Arrest  
**Introduced:** 02/11/2014  
**Location:** ASSEMBLY  
**Summary:** Amends existing law that authorizes a warrant of arrest, issued by a magistrate pursuant to a specific statute, to be substantially in a specified form. Changes all references in the specified form from magistrate to judge.

#### 27. [CA AB 1649](#)

**Author:** Waldron (R)  
**Title:** Computer Crimes  
**Introduced:** 02/11/2014  
**Location:** Assembly Public Safety Committee  
**Summary:** Increases the fine for a felony violation and for a misdemeanor violation for a person who knowingly and without permission disrupts or causes the disruption of government computer services or public safety infrastructure computer system computer services or denies or causes the denial of government computer services or public safety infrastructure computer system computer services to an authorized user. Revises the crime of knowingly using an Internet domain name of another individual or corporation.

#### 28. [CA AB 1698](#)

**Author:** Wagner (R)  
**Title:** Falsified Public Records  
**Introduced:** 02/13/2014  
**Location:** ASSEMBLY  
**Summary:** Provides a person who knowingly procures or offers any false or forged instrument to be filed, registered, or recorded in any public office within this state, which instrument, if genuine, might be filed, registered or recorded under any law of this state of the United States, is guilty of a felony. Provides that after a person is convicted of a violation of that law, the court is required to issue a written order that the false or forged instrument be adjudged void ab initio as false, or forged.

#### 29. [CA AB 1708](#)

**Author:** Alejo (D)  
**Title:** Jurors: Peace Officer Exemption  
**Introduced:** 02/13/2014  
**Location:** Assembly Judiciary Committee  
**Summary:** Excludes additional peace officers, including certain parole officers, probation officers, deputy probation officers, board coordinating parole agents, correctional officers, transportation officers of a probation department, and other employees of the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, the State Department of Mental Health, and the Board of Parole Hearings, from voir dire in civil and criminal matters.

#### 30. [CA AB 1715](#)

**Author:** Patterson (R)

**Title:** Probation: Felons: Disqualifying Circumstances  
**Introduced:** 02/13/2014  
**Location:** Assembly Public Safety Committee  
**Summary:** Amends existing law that defines probation to mean the suspension of the imposition or execution of a sentence and the order of conditional and revocable release in the community under the supervision of a probation officer. Makes that probation unavailable to a person who is convicted of a violent felony or a serious felony and who was on mandatory supervision or postrelease community supervision for a felony offense at the time of the commission of the new felony offense.

### 31. [CA AB 1718](#)

**Author:** Wagner (R)  
**Title:** Disorderly Conduct: Prostitution  
**Introduced:** 02/13/2014  
**Location:** ASSEMBLY  
**Summary:** Provides that a person who solicits or who agrees to engage in or who engages in any act of prostitution in exchange for his or her receipt of money or other consideration from another person is guilty of disorderly conduct. Relates to minors.

### 32. [CA AB 1733](#)

**Author:** Quirk-Silva (D)  
**Title:** Public Records: Fee Waiver  
**Introduced:** 02/14/2014  
**Location:** ASSEMBLY  
**Summary:** Requires the State Registrar to issue, without a fee, a certificate of live birth to an applicant who certifies, and provides sufficient corroborating evidence to demonstrate, that he or she is a homeless person. Requires the Department of Motor Vehicles to issue, without a fee, an identification card to an applicant who certifies, and provides sufficient corroborating evidence to demonstrate, that he or she is a homeless person.

### 33. [CA AB 1742](#)

**Author:** Maienschein (R)  
**Title:** Trial Court Funding  
**Introduced:** 02/14/2014  
**Location:** ASSEMBLY  
**Summary:** Makes technical, nonsubstantive changes to existing law that establishes the Trial Court Trust fund, the proceeds of which are required to be apportioned for authorized purposes, including apportionment to the trial courts to fund trial court operations.

### 34. [CA AB 1747](#)

**Author:** Holden (D)  
**Title:** Human Trafficking  
**Introduced:** 02/14/2014  
**Location:** ASSEMBLY  
**Summary:** States the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation to prevent human trafficking and

prostitution in massage therapy establishments.

### 35. [CA AB 1756](#)

**Author:** Skinner (D)  
**Title:** Court Records: Sealing and Destruction  
**Introduced:** 02/14/2014  
**Location:** ASSEMBLY  
**Summary:** Amends existing law that authorizes a person to petition the court for an order sealing the record of conviction and other official records in a case in which that person was under 18 years of age at the time of commission of a misdemeanor and is eligible for, or has previously received, specified relief. Makes persons 26 years of age or older liable to reimburse the court, the county, or any city for the cost of services.

### 36. [CA AB 1761](#)

**Author:** Hall (D)  
**Title:** Commercially Sexually Exploited Minors  
**Introduced:** 02/14/2014  
**Location:** ASSEMBLY  
**Summary:** States the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation to reduce the number of commercially sexually exploited minors, to protect minors from being sold on the streets, and to ensure that those minors have safe and nurturing families providing them with opportunities to thrive.

### 37. [CA AB 1768](#)

**Author:** Fong (D)  
**Title:** Declaration of Candidacy: Residence Address  
**Introduced:** 02/14/2014  
**Location:** ASSEMBLY  
**Summary:** Exempts from the requirement to state a residence address on a declaration of candidacy a candidate for any office whose voter registration information is confidential.

### 38. [CA AB 1772](#)

**Author:** Williams (D)  
**Title:** Law Enforcement Telecommunications Advisory Committee  
**Introduced:** 02/14/2014  
**Location:** ASSEMBLY  
**Summary:** Amends existing law that requires the Attorney General to appoint an advisory committee on the California Law Enforcement Telecommunications System to advise and assist in the management of the system. Changes the membership of the committee.

### 39. [CA AB 1775](#)

**Author:** Melendez (R)  
**Title:** Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting Act  
**Introduced:** 02/18/2014

**Location:** ASSEMBLY  
**Summary:** Amends the Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting Act. Provides that sexual exploitation also includes a person who knowingly download a film, photograph, video tape, negative, or slide in which a child is engaged in an act of obscene sexual conduct.

#### 40. [CA AB 1791](#)

**Author:** Maienschein (R)  
**Title:** Human Trafficking  
**Introduced:** 02/18/2014  
**Location:** ASSEMBLY  
**Summary:** Expands the scope of sex offenses and extortion crimes and the Sex Offender Registration Act to apply to a person who recruits, harbors, transports, provides, sells purchases, or obtains, or attempts to recruit, harbor, transport, provide, sell, purchase, or obtain, a person who is a minor at the time of commission of the offense to engage in a commercial sex act.

#### 41. [CA AB 1798](#)

**Author:** Assembly Public Safety Committee  
**Title:** Deadly Weapons  
**Introduced:** 02/18/2014  
**Location:** ASSEMBLY  
**Summary:** Makes technical, nonsubstantive changes to existing law that requires the Attorney General to keep records of copies of fingerprints and licenses to carry concealed firearms and other documents relating to the transfer of firearms, and authorizes the dissemination of specified information relating to firearms transactions and possession by laws enforcement agencies, the courts, and other specified officers if certain conditions are met.

#### 42. [CA AB 1850](#)

**Author:** Waldron (R)  
**Title:** Restraining Orders  
**Introduced:** 02/19/2014  
**Location:** ASSEMBLY  
**Summary:** Authorizes a court with jurisdiction over a criminal matter to issue an order protecting a witness of violent crime from all contact by the defendant upon a good cause belief that harm to, or intimidation or dissuasion of, that witness has occurred or is reasonably likely to occur.

#### 43. [CA AB 1887](#)

**Author:** Campos (D)  
**Title:** Prostitution: Human Trafficking: Records  
**Introduced:** 02/19/2014  
**Location:** ASSEMBLY  
**Summary:** Authorizes a person to petition a court to set aside a conviction for an offense relating to solicitation or prostitution based on a finding that the person is factually innocent of the

charge if the person is a victim of human trafficking and the offense is a result of the petitioner's status as a victim of that crime.

#### 44. CA AB 1894

**Author:** Wieckowski (D)  
**Title:** Falsely Filed Liens or Encumbrances  
**Introduced:** 02/19/2014  
**Location:** ASSEMBLY  
**Summary:** Makes it a misdemeanor for any person to file, attempt to file, or conspire to file, in any public record, or any private record that is generally available to the public, any false lien or encumbrance against the real or personal property of a peace officer on account of the performance of that peace officer's official duties, if the person filing or attempting to file knows, or has reason to know, that the lien or encumbrance is false.

#### 45. CA AB 1900

**Author:** Quirk (D)  
**Title:** Victims of Sex Crimes: Testimony: Video-Recording  
**Introduced:** 02/19/2014  
**Location:** ASSEMBLY  
**Summary:** Allows a court to use any means of video-recording to comply with specified recording and preservation requirements.

#### 46. CA AB 1919

**Author:** Perez V (D)  
**Title:** Inmates: Local Supervision: Assessment  
**Introduced:** 02/19/2014  
**Location:** ASSEMBLY  
**Summary:** Provides for better assessment of inmates in local facilities for purposes of local supervision after their release, or local supervision as an alternative to incarceration.

#### 47. CA AB 1960

**Author:** Perea (D)  
**Title:** Criminal History Information: State Hospitals  
**Introduced:** 02/19/2014  
**Location:** ASSEMBLY  
**Summary:** Requires the Attorney General to provide state summary criminal history information to the director of a state hospital, or his or her designee, for a patient committed to that facility for treatment. Requires the state hospital to only use the information for the purpose of treatment or the determination of security required for that patient.

#### 48. CA AB 1964

**Author:** Dickinson (D)  
**Title:** unsafe Handguns  
**Introduced:** 02/19/2014

**Location:** ASSEMBLY

**Summary:** Makes the provisions defining and governing unsafe handguns inapplicable to a single-shot pistol with a break top or bolt action. Makes this exception inapplicable to a semiautomatic pistol that has been temporarily or permanently altered so that it will not fire in a semiautomatic mode.

#### 49. CA AB 1985

**Author:** Donnelly (R)

**Title:** Firearms: Prohibitions: Exemptions

**Introduced:** 02/19/2014

**Location:** ASSEMBLY

**Summary:** Amends existing law that makes it a crime to possess an assault weapon, and a crime to possess or manufacture, distribute, transport, import for sale, keep for sale, offer or expose for sale, or give or lend any .50 BMG rifle. Makes the above prohibitions inapplicable to the sale to, purchase by, importation of, or possession of assault weapons or a .50 BMG rifle by any federal correctional agency.

#### 50. CA AB 2002

**Title:** Wireless Communication Devices: Correctional Facilities

**Introduced:** 02/20/2014

**Location:** ASSEMBLY

Includes human trafficking, pimping, and pandering in those offenses.

Limits the data that may be provided by hospitals and trauma centers to the number of overdoses and the substances suspected as the cause of the overdose.
